My Numismatic Summer

During the summer I was an intern with Heritage Numismatic Auctions and I attended both of ANA's Summer Seminars.

While I was interning with Heritage I was assisting the consignment directors and their assistant and working in the auction department. My responsibilities as a consignment directors' assistant were to open incoming consignments, make sure the proper paper work was included and complete and move the coins along in the system. While working with consignment directors I was able to handle lots of coins, along with some currency as they were being processed. In addition to helping process the consignments I worked on a research project and made pricing spreadsheets that will be used on their website. While working in the auction department I was scanning images of currency and coins. Most of the currency will be in the upcoming Cincinnati, Ohio auction and the coins were slated for a world coin auction. Some of the currency was also in an Exclusively Internet auction. While working in the auction department I was able to observe how the customer service employees work with the bidders. While at Heritage I was able to learn about how some departments in a large auction firm are run and was allowed to handle millions of dollars of numismatic items.

During the first week of the summer seminar I was in the US National Bank Notes class taught by Peter Huntoon and Mark Hotz. During the class we were able to see many notes from their collections and from the collections of fellow classmates.

We were also able to view some of the nationals in the Bebee Collection that ANA has as part of their museum collection. One of the speakers that came to class was Joe Boling. He spoke to us about counterfeit notes. Joe had examples of cancelled counterfeits and matching real notes. Someone else that came to speak to the class had a nearly complete collection of all Nebraska bank charter numbers. He showed the class some of the notes in his collection including a couple that were the only known examples. During this week of the seminar I went to Pike's Peak on the cog rail. While we were at the top of Pike's Peak it was snowing slightly and I brought home a piece of Pike's Peak granite as a souvenir.

During the second week of the seminar I was in the US Tokens class taught by David Schenkman. The token class was not my first choice however I did enjoy the class and learned a lot. During class we were able to see slides of and actual tokens. Some of the tokens being passed around were very rare, being one of five or less. Most of the tokens that were shown during class were part of David's collection that he using for teaching the tokens class. A couple of others in the class had tokens for everyone to see. Also attending the class were my dad, John and Nancy Wilson and David Sklow. During this week of the seminar we were able to take a tour of the Denver Mint. We were given a floor tour and were able to see the new way of bagging the coins. While we were there they were minting 2003 dimes, nickels and cents.

The YN Auctions that were held each week to raise scholarship money for future YNs to attend the seminar raised a record of \$40,000.

In conclusion, I had a very interesting summer that was filled with numismatic related adventures.

The Nickel Series

The five-cent piece of seventy-five percent copper and twenty-five percent nickel was first authorized on May 16, 1866. The nickel has been remarkably stable since its introduction with only a few minor changes being made to it. The weight has stayed the same since the beginning and the diameter of the coin has only changed once. The diameter increased about one millimeter in the late 1880s. The composition changed in 1942 thru 1945 to fifty-six percent copper, thirty-five percent silver and nine percent manganese. Also a large mintmark was added above the Monticello, including for the first time a P for Philadelphia. The change in the composition was made because during World War II copper and nickel became a strategic material along with tin. This caused the Mint to experiment with iron, zinc, early plastics and even glass.

James Barton Longacre, who was the mint's chief engraver from 1844-1869, designed the first nickel. The obverse of the coin had a shield and that is why the coin became known as the shield nickel. The design had rays on the reverse between the stars and the following year the rays were removed from the design. The shield nickel was introduced just as the nation was coming out of the Civil War and rebuilding would take time and money. During the war, silver and gold were not circulating and the shield nickels as well as lower denominations were created specifically because they could circulate without being hoarded. Critics dubbed it "the ugliest of all know coins," and described the shield as "a tombstone surmounted by a cross overhung by weeping willows." Many people thought that the stars and rays represented the "stars and bars" of the Confederate flag. Still, the nickel was an instant success, and in 1867 a record thirty million of them were made.

Charles Barber replaced the shield design in 1883 with the Liberty head design. Charles was the chief engraver for the Mint from 1879-1917. On the first date, the denomination appeared only as Roman V or 5, with the result that the coins were gilded, given a reeded edge and passed off as half eagles. The coins could be passed off as the higher denomination five-dollar pieces because they looked very similar to them. The nickels that were passed off were given the nickname racketeer nickel. People would go to areas that were not familiar with the new coins and get a small item and pay for it with the racketeer nickel. The next year and all following the word CENTS appears on all subsequent issues. The Liberty head design was issued until 1913. The 1913 Liberty head nickels are very rare and there are only five reported. The fifth 1913 nickel has recently come back to the public eye after being in passed down in the Walton family for nearly forty-one years. This was not a regular issue, and was apparently struck for or by Samuel W. Brown, a one-time clerk and storekeeper at the Philadelphia Mint who went public in December 1919 by advertising to buy specimens in Proof for \$500. In a March 2001 auction one sold for \$1,840,000.

News that the Treasury Department was considering a replacement for the nickel design received the attention of James Fraser, an accomplished sculptor who had been one of Augustus Saint-Gauden's star pupils. Fraser then thirty-five years old, took the initiative by engaging Mint Director George E. Roberts with a proposal to enter upon the task himself. James Fraser was already renowned for his sculptural works depicting Native Americans. He envisioned a tribute featuring a portrait bust on one side and a bison on the other. In 1911, sculptor James Earle Fraser began designing the Indian head-Buffalo five-cent piece that was issued until 1938. The Indian Head five-cent coin is considered by many collectors to be among the most beautiful

coins struck for circulation by the United States Mint. The first Indian head/ Buffalo Nickels coined for circulation were struck on February 17 and the coins were released March 4. By sheer coincidence, this was one day before President Woodrow Wilson's first inaugural.

The Indian used on the five-cent piece introduced in 1913 is not the image of any one individual but is a composite of several Indians studied by the designer. The Indians are identified as Iron Tail, a Sioux, Two Moons, a Cheyenne, and Big Tree, a Kiowa. Two Moons died in 1917, and Iron Tail and Big Tree in the 1920s. In the 1960s a second Big Tree appeared at coin shows and claimed to be the Native American on the nickel. Although he claimed to have celebrated his 100th birthday in 1962, later records indicated he was actually only 87. The Buffalo reverse of the coin was modeled after Black Diamond, who was in the New York City's Bronx Park Zoo, not the Central Park Zoo as is often claimed. This animal was uncooperative and would not stay posed in profile like the coin depicted. Fraser had to bribe a zoo attendant to distract the animal so that he was able to capture the likeness he wanted. Already about 20 years old in 1912, Black Diamond was soon declared too elderly to stay on at the zoo. He was put up for auction, the beast failed to realize a sale. Black Diamond was eventually sold for \$300 to a poultry and game dealer by the name of A. Silz who had him slaughtered in 1915. The meat was offered at \$2 per pound as Black Diamond steaks, while the head was mounted by Fred Santer of New York City, who also fashioned a 13-foot square automobile blanket from its hide. After its whereabouts had been untraced for decades, the mounted head of Black Diamond reappeared as an attraction at the 1985 convention of the American Numismatic Association held in Baltimore.

In 1938 the Indian head design was replaced with Jefferson. This is the same design that is in circulation today. Another change made in 1938 was that IN GOD WE TRUST first appeared on the nickel. Felix Schlag's design won the competition with about 390 other artists competing and an award of \$1,000. Felix's original design was changed because the design was too much for the Mint officials. The original design was an imaginative three-quarters perspective of Jefferson's home Monticello. Beginning in 1966, Schlag's FS initials appear below the bust on the obverse. Members of the Virginia delegation introduced legislation after Mint officials in 2002 announced plans to redesign the nickel in 2003. The legislation would keep Jefferson and his home on the coin. The design was planned to commemorate the Louisiana Purchase and the Corps of Discovery led by Lewis and Clark. The new designs would be during 2003, 2004, and 2005. This legislation has already been passed by the U.S. House of Representatives. The new nickels have yet to be minted and will not be out by the end of the year.
